# Self-build Register Application Form for Associations

Blaby District Council has a legal duty under the Self-build and Custom Housebuilding Act 2015 to keep a register of individuals and associations of individuals who wish to acquire serviced plots of land within the District to bring forward self-build and custom housebuilding projects.

We advise that you read the Self-build Register Frequently Asked Questions document prior to completing this form so that you understand the application process.

If you are seeking, either alone or with others, to acquire a serviced plot of land to build a house to occupy as your main or sole residence, then you need to complete the Individual Form.

If you are a group of individuals, or represent a group of individuals (to be referred to as an association of individuals) who want to acquire one or more serviced plots of land to undertake a self-build or custom housebuilding project, then you need to complete the Form for Associations.

Please make sure that you are completing the correct version of the form.

Entry on to the Register does not guarantee that a suitable plot of land will be identified or become available. The Register provides the Council with valuable information on demand for self-build and custom housebuilding in the local area and is a key part of the Council's evidence base for this type of housing.

Please read the questions carefully and answer truthfully. If at a later date it is found that the applicant is not eligible for inclusion in the Register, the Council has the right to remove an entry from the Register.

Personal details included on the register will not be made public, but anonymous headline data extracted from it may be published (i.e. overall numbers of registered entries for various categories, geographical areas of interest, types of housing sought etc.).

To keep the Register up-to-date, the Council will review entries in the Register every 2 years from the date of entry into the Register. This will involve contacting the named individual or Lead Contact of the Association to confirm that the details they have provided remain accurate and that they still intend to undertake a self-build project within the District.

Q1. To be eligible for entry in the Register, each member of the Association must meet all of the following three criteria:

- (i) Be aged 18 and over;
- (ii) Be a British citizen, a national of an EEA State other than the United Kingdom, or a national of Switzerland;
- (iii) Seeking (either alone or with others) to acquire a serviced plot of land within Blaby District to build a house to occupy as their sole or main residence.
