Tackling Anti-social Behaviour in Blaby District

Anti-social behaviour can affect anyone and can have serious consequences for both individuals and communities alike. Blaby District Council is committed to working in partnership with agencies to challenge and prevent anti-social behaviour across our District.



What is anti-social behaviour?

Anti-social behaviour (ASB) is behaviour that causes harassment, alarm and distress to other people. ASB shows a lack of consideration to other residents and visitors to our district and has a negative effect on the quality of life in communities.

Examples of ASB are:

- Intimidating behaviour
- Abusive language
- Nuisance neighbours
- Drunken behaviour
- Noise nuisance
- Graffiti
- Vandalism
- Vehicle nuisance
- Littering or fly tipping

Example of action we can take:

- Advice and/or Warning letters
- Acceptable Behaviour Contracts
- Criminal Behaviour Orders
- Closure Orders
- Community Protection Notices

Examples of behaviour we will not deal with as ASB:

- Children playing
- Neighbours doing DIY (at reasonable times of the day)
- Groups of people in the street or in parks, unless they are being rowdy, abusive, causing damage or committing other crimes
- Noise caused by everyday living
- Religious or cultural practice

What can we do to tackle ASB?

We work together with partner agencies to cover all aspects of ASB from prevention through to referring victims for appropriate support. In some cases, action may be taken against those responsible which can range from verbal advice and warnings to enforcement such as closure of premises.



What can you expect if you make a complaint of ASB?

- We will listen to your concerns and take them seriously
- We will treat your information confidentially and ask for your permission to share with partner agencies
- We will refer people affected by ASB for support where appropriate
- We will keep you regularly updated in the progress of your case
- We will explain if we are unable to assist and why
- If you are unhappy with the outcome of your case, you can request an ASB Review which

- You have the right to complain if you are dissatisfied with the service you receive or the outcome of your case
